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WAIMATE BOROUGH COUNCIL

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loan Act, 1926, the Waimate Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £7,000, authorized to be raised by the Waimate Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of providing drainage works, sewerage works, and works for the disposal of sewerage for the Public Hospital, Masseytown, and the area north and west of Naylor Street and Mill Road, the said Waimate Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one penny and one farthing (1½d.) in the pound upon the unimproved value of all rateable property within the said borough; and that such special rate shall by an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off."

TAURANGA COUNTY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Bridges Loan, £2,000 (of £5,000), 1941

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and all other powers (if any) thereunto enabling, the Tauranga County Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of the half-yearly instalments of the principal and interest in respect of the Tauranga County Council's Bridges Loan of £2,000, 1941, authorized to be raised by the Tauranga County Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of providing the County Council's share of the cost of replacing and reconstructing bridges within the county, the said Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-thirtieth of a penny (1/30d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the County of Tauranga; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable annually on the 1st day of September in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five years or until the loan is fully paid off."
