WHEREAS the Otago Hospital Board (hereinafter called "the said local authority"), being desirous of raising a loan of one hundred and eighty-three thousand pounds (£183,000), to be known as "Hospital (No. 1) Loan, 1943" (hereinafter called "the said loan"), for the purpose of providing a physio-therapy block and equipment, a nurses' home kitchen, and dining-room block, including lecture and recreation rooms, and an out-patient block, has complied with the provisions of the Local Government Loans Board Act, 1926 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), and it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council, as required by the said Act, should be given to the raising of the said loan:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on

him by section eleven of the said Act, as set out in section twenty-nine of the Finance Act, 1932 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby consent to the raising in New Zealand by the said local authority of the said loan for the said purpose up to the amount of one hundred and eighty-three thousand pounds (£183,000), and in giving such consent doth hereby determine as follows:—

(1) The term for which the said loan or any part thereof may be

borrowed shall be twenty (20) years.

(2) The rate of interest that may be paid in respect of the said loan or any part thereof shall be such as shall not produce to the lender or lenders a rate exceeding three pounds five shillings (£3 5s.) per centum per annum.

(3) The said loan or any part thereof shall be repaid by equal half-yearly instalments of principal of not less than four thousand five hundred and seventy-five pounds (£4,575) each extending over the term of the loan.

(4) The payment of interest and instalments of principal in respect of the said loan shall be made in New Zealand and no amount payable as interest or principal shall be paid out of loan-moneys.

(5) The rate payable for brokerage, underwriting, and procuration fees in respect of the raising of the said loan or any part thereof shall not in the aggregate exceed one-half per centum of any amount

(6) No moneys shall be borrowed under this consent after the expiration of two years from the date hereof.
