(This declaration includes all persons employed in manufacturing, farming, vegetable-growing, and other industrial activities carried out by Government Departments being persons engaged as above, but does not apply to contractors or subcontractors carrying out work on behalf of Government Departments or to persons employed by such contractors or subcontractors.)

For the purposes of this declaration the Service of the Government as defined herein constitutes a visible undertaking.
