SCHEDULE

AREA PROPOSED TO BE CONSTITUTED AS THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT MAUNGANUI

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, situated in Blocks VI and VII, Tauranga Survey District, commencing at a point where the road forming the southern boundary of Te Awa-o-Tururako No. 2 Block meets the Tauranga Harbour; thence easterly along the northern side of the aforesaid road and its production across a public road to Whareroa No. 2J Block; thence along the north-western boundary of the last-mentioned block to the Mount Maunganui Branch line of the East Coast Main Trunk Railway; thence by a right line across the aforesaid railway and public road to the southernmost corner of Lot 35 on plan 6922, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence along the road forming the south-eastern boundaries of Lots 35 and 67 on plan 6922 aforesaid, across a public road, and along the road forming the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Lot 84 on plan 6922 aforesaid, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary across a public road to Omanu No. 2B No. 3 Block; thence along the western boundary of the last-mentioned block to the sea; thence north-westerly generally along the coast-line of the Bay of Plenty and south-easterly generally along the coast-line of the Tauranga Harbour to the point of commencement.
