RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE OF ONE PENNY HALFPENNY (1½d.) IN THE POUND (£) AS SECURITY FOR THE WAIPORI FALLS ELECTRICAL POWER REPAYMENT LOAN, 1945, OF £85,000

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Dunedin City Council hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £85,000, authorized to be raised by the Dunedin City Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of repaying in part the ‘Waipori Falls Electrical Power Loan, 1929,’ of £100,000, maturing in London on the 1st February, 1945, the said Dunedin City Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one penny halfpenny (1½d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value (on the basis of the annual value) of all rateable property of the City of Dunedin, comprising the whole of the said city; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the first (1st) day of June in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirteen (13) years or until the loan is fully paid off.”

*Footpaths, Kerbing, and Borough Improvements Loan, 1944, £3,500*
