# Price Order No. 345 (Char)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 345, and shall come into force on the 19th day of March, 1945.

### APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies only with respect to char manufactured at Rotowaro and sold by a wholesaler or retailer for use in the North Island.
