Additional Land near Riverton taken for the Purposes of the Western Railways

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it has been found desirable for the use, convenience, and enjoyment of the Western Railways to take further land near Riverton in addition to land previously acquired for the purposes of the said railway:

Now, therefore, I, Cyril Louis Norton Newall, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by sections thirty-four and two hundred and sixteen of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby taken for the purposes above mentioned.

SCHEDULE

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land: 5.4 perches.
Part Section 10, Block I, Jacobs River Hundred.

Situated in Wallace County. (S.O. 5607.)

In the Southland Land District; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked L.O. 7669, deposited in the office of the Minister of Railways at Wellington, and thereon coloured blue.
