The Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 35

IN pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, the Minister of Labour doth hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Variation No. 35.
2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
3. The principal Order is varied as follows, namely: The provisions of the principal Order shall not apply to the workers coming within the scope of any of the awards or agreement specified in the following Schedule.

The Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, and its Amendments.—Fixing the Closing-hours of Fruiterers' Shops within the Borough of Waipukurau

WHEREAS a requisition in writing has been forwarded to the Minister of Labour from the occupiers of fruiterers' shops within the Borough of Waipukurau, pursuant to section 32 of the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22:

And whereas he is satisfied that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the said shops within the said borough:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 32, the Minister of Labour doth hereby direct that on and after the 4th day of June, 1945, all the said shops within the said borough shall be closed on the evening of working-days as follows: On Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays at 6.30 p.m., on Tuesdays and Saturdays at 8 p.m., and on Fridays at 9 p.m., with the following exceptions—(1) on the evening of the working-day immediately preceding Good Friday the closing-hour shall be 10 p.m., and (2) during the weeks in which Christmas Day and New Year's Day occur there shall be no fixed closing-hour.

The notice gazetted on the 5th May, 1938,* fixing the closing-hours of fruiterers' shops within the Borough of Waipukurau shall be and is hereby cancelled as from the date of the coming into operation of this notice.

Notice to make Returns of Income under the Land and Income Tax Act, 1923, and Amendments

EVERY person and company, whether a taxpayer or not, having derived income during the year ended 31st March, 1945, from any source or by any means which is made the subject of taxation under the Land and Income Tax Act, 1923, or any amendment thereof, is hereby required to forward to or deliver at my office, Wellington C. 3, in the prescribed form (obtainable at any post-office), returns of such income on or before the 1st June, 1945.

Where returns are accepted for a year ending later than 31st March they are required to be made within two months of such later date.

Details of persons liable to furnish returns are displayed at post-offices.

Any person failing to furnish a return at the prescribed time is liable to a penalty up to £1'0.
