Price Order No. 372 (Amending Price Order No. 128) (Eggs)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 372, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 128† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 28th day of May, 1945.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by adding to clause 7 thereof the following additional subclause:—

“(3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any producer for preserved eggs sold in a quantity of less than 30 dozen to any person authorized under the provisions of paragraph (a) of subclause (2) of Regulation 4 of the Egg Marketing Emergency Regulations 1942‡ to purchase such eggs, when sold in any marketing area within an egg-price area or elsewhere than in a marketing area, shall be the appropriate maximum price fixed for preserved eggs in either the Second or the Third Schedule hereto (whichever is applicable) as amended or substituted from time to time, reduced by 2½d.”
