- (b) By inserting after clause 9 the following additional clause:-

Where any wholesaler who does not normally carry on business as a distributor sells any onions to another wholesaler (thus business as a distributor sens any official to another wholesater (thus becoming a distributor in respect of that transaction) the price to be charged by the vendor may exceed the maximum price determined in accordance with the last preceding clause by such amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the parties to the transaction: Provided that in any such case the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler in accordance with the next succeeding clause shall be determined as if he had bought the onions at the price paid by the wholesaler from whom he bought them.'
- (c) By inserting after clause 10 the following additional heading and clause:-
- "Distributors and other Wholesalers to specify Grades of Onions on Relevant Invoices

Price Order No. 384 (Amending Price Order No. 340) (Main Crop Potatoss)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 384, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 340† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
 This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1945.

## APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all potatoes which, being subject to the principal Order, are sold by a grower for delivery at any time after the commencement of this Order and on or before the 30th day of November, 1945.

(2) For the purposes of this Order no potatoes sold on the basis of f.o.b.s.i. or f.o.r.s.i. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order if—

- (a) In the case of sales f.o.b.s.i. the vessel on which the
- (a) In the case of sales 1.0.5.3.1. the vessel on which the potatoes are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight on the 30th day of June, 1945; or (b) In the case of sales f.o.r.s.i. the trucks on which the potatoes are laden leave the grower's station at any time before midnight of the said date.
- (3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, potatoes sold f.o.b.s.i. or f.o.r.s.i. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.

MODIFICATION OF PRINCIPAL ORDER WITH RESPECT TO POTATOES THAT ARE SUBJECT TO THIS ORDER

- 4. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the principal Order the actual price to be charged by any grower for f.a.q. potatoes and the maximum price to be charged by any such contrary in the for under-grade potatoes shall be determined in accordance with the following scale, namely:-
- (a) For Sutton's Supreme or King Edward potatoes grown in the South Island and sold for delivery—

(c) For potatoes (other than "tagged" potatoes) grown in the North Island and sold for delivery—

Per Ton f.o.r.s.i. the Grower's Station. Actual Price (f.a.q.). Maximum Price (Under-grade). From 1st July to 31st July, 1945 £ s. d. (both days inclusive) . . 11 0 0 £ s. d.

From August, 1945, to November, 1945: Pending the issue of an amending Price Order, and subject to the provisions of any such Order, the prices as at 31st July, 1945, shall also apply with respect to potatoes sold for delivery in the months of August to November.

(2) With respect to "tagged" potatoes the prices to be charged by the grower shall not be less than the prices fixed in accordance with paragraph (c) of the last preceding subclause for f.a.q. potatoes, but may exceed such prices by an amount not exceeding 10s. a ton in any case.
