Price Order No. 470 (Amending Price Order No. 358) (White Oats)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

- This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 470, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 358† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
 This Order shall come into force on the 15th day of
- December, 1945.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- 3. (1) This Order applies with respect to all white oats which, being subject to the principal Order, are delivered to a purchaser at any time after the commencement of this Order.
- (2) For the purposes of this clause, no oats shall be deemed to be delivered to a purchaser after the commencement of this Order
 - (a) In the case of oats delivered at the grower's station, the trucks on which the oats are laden leave the grower's station at any time before midnight on the 14th day of December, 1945:
 - (b) In the case of oats delivered on board any vessel, if the vessel on which the oats are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight on the said date.
- (3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, oats shall be deemed to be delivered to a purchaser after the commencement of this Order, notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.

AMENDMENT OF PRICES UNDER PRINCIPAL ORDER

- 4. The principal Order is hereby amended as follows:
- (a) By omitting from subclause (1) of clause 5 and from subclause (2) of clause 6 the price figure "3s. 8d.", and substituting in each case the price figure "4s.":
 (b) By omitting from subclause (1) of clause 6 the price figure "3s. 9½d.", and substituting the price figure "4s. 1½d.".
