*Alteration of Boundaries of Kaingaroa Fire District*

WHEREAS by a notice published in the *Gazette* on the 15th day of November, 1945, at page 1419 (hereinafter referred to as "the said notice"), a certain area in the Auckland Land District was declared to be a fire district under section 27 of the Forests Act, 1921-22 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and named the Kaingaroa Fire District:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the Kaingaroa Fire District:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, and on the recommendation of the Director of Forestry and of the Land Board of the Auckland Land District, I hereby revoke the said notice, in so far as it relates to the Kaingaroa Fire District, and do declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a fire district to be known as the Kaingaroa-Rotorua Fire District; and, with respect to the fire district constituted as aforesaid, I do further specify the period from the 1st day of October in any year to the 15th day of April in the following year, inclusive, as the period during which it
