RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Water-reticulation Renewal and Water-pumping Station Renewal Loan, 1945

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Wairoa Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and the other charges on a loan of £10,300, authorized to be raised by the Wairoa Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the water-reticulation renewal and water-pumping station renewal, the said Wairoa Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 1·38 pence in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Wairoa Borough, comprising of whole of the Borough of Wairoa; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 14th day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of fifteen years or until the loan is fully paid off."
