Vesting the Control of a Scenic Reserve in the Waikaka Scenic Board

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby revoke a Warrant dated the twenty-fifth day of March, doth hereby revoke a Warrant dated the twenty-fitth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and published in the Gazette of the twenty-seventh day of that month, vesting the control of a scenic reserve in the Waikaka Scenic Board, and doth hereby vest the control of the scenic reserve described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act), for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

4. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at the meeting.

7. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings

of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
