WHEREAS John Gibbs Churchill, of Wellington (hereinafter referred to as the contributor), is, and from the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, has been, exclusively engaged as an employee of the New Zealand Post and Telegraph Employees' Association and Officers' Guild (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the Association), being an approved organization within the meaning of section fifteen of the Finance Act (No. 2), 1040.

And whereas, immediately prior to being so engaged with the Association, the contributor was a contributor to the Public Service Superannuation Fund and was then contributing to the said fund five per centum of his salary:
