SCHEDULE

THE MASTERTON MILK DELIVERY SCHEME, 1946

(1) For the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise

"The district" means the area inclusive of the part of the Borough of Masterton and of areas adjoining thereto as

(4) The functions of the Committee shall be to receive and investigate complaints affecting the administration of this scheme, to advise the Minister of any matters that may be referred to the committee by the Minister or that may be considered by it of its own motion, and to make recommendations to the Minister for

(5) Subject to all the provisions of this scheme, the committee may regulate its procedure in such manner as it thinks fit.

(6) Deliveries of milk under contract to schools, public hospitals, and to establishments of the Armed Forces are excluded from this
