

Price Order No. 575 (Patons and Baldwins Wools, Canvas, Knitting Pins, and Booklets)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 575, and shall come into force on the 11th day of July, 1946.

2. (1) Price Order No. 344† is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to Patons and Baldwins wools, canvas, knitting pins, and booklets of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF GOODS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any goods to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

Price Order No. 576 ("Lavenda" Wool)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 576, and shall come into force on the 11th day of July, 1946.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies with respect to three-ply "Lavenda" Hand Knitting Wool.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF WOOL TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Price

3. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause the maximum prices that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any wool to which this Order applies shall be 19s. 8d. per pound.

(2) The maximum price fixed as aforesaid shall be reduced by a discount of 2½ per cent. thereof where payment is made on or before the 10th day of the month following the month in which delivery is made to the purchaser.

Retailers' Price

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any wool to which this Order applies shall be 1s. 9d. per ounce.
