# 7. Social and Cultural Services

The provision of sites, buildings, and services throughout the area for social and cultural purposes, including-

(a) New hospitals, hospital extensions, and ancillary buildings for the South Canterbury Hospital Board at Timaru, Temuka, and Waimate:
(b) The improvement of school facilities generally throughout the area, including additions to and partial rebuilding of Ashburton East Primary and Timaru Technical School, provision of a new combined secondary school at Ashburton, and the provision of a new secondary department at the Temuka District High School.

#### 8. Defence

Construction and improvement of defence installations.

# 9. Public Administration

New facilities for Government and local administration. including-

- (a) Construction of new departmental buildings to house local offices of Government Departments, the principal building being at Timaru:
- (b) New police-station and new courthouse at Timaru.
