*Price Order No. 604 (U.S.A. Safety Matches)*

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 604, and shall come into force on the 16th day of September, 1946.

## APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

2. This Order applies only with respect to safety matches manufactured in the United States of America and sold in New Zealand.

## FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF MATCHES TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

*Wholesalers' Price*

3. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any safety matches to which this Order applies shall be 11s. 6d. per gross boxes, less the appropriate rate of cash discount customarily allowed prior to the coming into force of this Order according to the class of business of the retailer to whom the sale is made.

*Retailers' Price*

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any safety matches to which this Order applies shall be—

Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of safety matches or may relate generally to all safety matches to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.
