*Exemption Order under the Motor-drivers Regulations 1940*

**P**URSUANT to the Motor-drivers Regulations\* 1940, the Minister of Transport doth hereby order and declare that the provisions of clause (1) of Regulation 7 of the said regulations, so far as they relate to the driving of heavy trade motors, shall not apply to the person hereinafter mentioned, but in lieu thereof the following provisions shall apply:—

A motor-driver's license issued under the Motor-drivers Regulations 1940 to the person described in Column 1 of the Schedule hereunder may authorize him to drive a heavy trade motor in the course of his employment on a farm or market-garden of the employer described in Column 2 of the said Schedule, but shall not authorize him, while he is under the age of eighteen years, to drive a heavy trade motor for any other purpose.

*Amending the Extended River Limits out of Leigh Cove*

**I**N pursuance of the power and authority conferred upon me by section 189 of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, I, James O'Brien, Minister of Marine, do hereby revoke the Warrant dated the 15th day of April, 1946, and published in the *Gazette* on the 2nd day of May, 1946, at page 549, defining extended river limits for deep-sea sports fishing out of Leigh Cove, and do hereby define Leigh Cove extended river limits within which extended river limit vessels may ply to be within a fifteen-mile radius of the eastern entrance of Leigh Cove, Auckland Province.

*The Wool Packing Control Order 1946*

**P**URSUANT to the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939, the Minister of Agriculture hereby makes the following Order.

## ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Wool Packing Control Order 1946.
2. This Order shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
3. Every bale of wool sold or offered for sale shall be so packed that the weight of the wool and the container shall not exceed 400 lb. avoirdupois.
4. No person shall pack any bale of wool otherwise than in accordance with the requirements of this Order.
