Price Order No. 609 (Amending Price Order No. 3) (Scrap Metal)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 609, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 3† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 3rd day of October, 1946.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by omitting therefrom all references to pure lead and to battery lead.

Price Order No. 610 (Amending Price Order No. 370) (Prunes)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 610, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 370† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 7th day of October, 1946.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking clause 4 and substituting the following clause:—

“4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any prunes shall be—

“(a) For prunes sold in any area (whether a ‘free delivery’ area or not) within which any wholesale general merchant carrying on business in any of the cities or boroughs of Auckland, Blenheim, Christchurch, Dannevirke, Dunedin, Gisborne, Greymouth, Hamilton, Hastings, Hawera, Hokitika, Invercargill, Masterton, Napier, Nelson, New Plymouth, Palmerston North, Timaru, Wanganui, Westport, or Wellington normally undertakes the delivery of goods to retailers—
