*The Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943.—Notice declaring Land taken for the Settlement of a Discharged Serviceman*

WHEREAS an application has been made for the consent of the Land Sales Court to a transaction which relates to the land described in the Schedule hereto and to which Part III of the Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943, applies:

And whereas the Land Sales Committee to which the application has been referred is of opinion that the land to which the application relates is farm land suitable or adaptable for the settlement of a discharged serviceman:

And whereas the said committee, not being satisfied that the Crown had decided not to acquire or arrange for the acquisition of the land, did on the 3rd day of June, 1947, make an order determining the basic value of the land and no appeal from the said order was made within the time prescribed by the said Act or within any further time allowed by the Court:

And whereas the said land is not the land of any serviceman who is for the time being serving outside New Zealand in any of His Majesty's Forces or in any British ship:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Lands, acting in pursuance of section 51 of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the said land is taken for the settlement of a discharged serviceman, and hereby specifies the 24th day of July, 1947, as the date on which the said land shall be deemed to be vested in His Majesty the King.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Lands, acting in pursuance of section 51 of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the said land is taken for the settlement of a discharged serviceman, and hereby specifies the 17th day of July, 1947, as the date on which the said land shall be deemed to be vested in His Majesty the King.

*The Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943.—Notice declaring Land taken for the Settlement of Discharged Servicemen*

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 24 of the Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943, notice was given of the intention of the Minister of Lands to take under Part II of the said Act the lands described in the First Schedule hereto, and a copy of the said notice was published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 46 on the 27th day of June, 1946, at page 915:

And whereas an objection was made by the owner in the manner prescribed by the said Act, objecting to the taking of the said lands and claiming a retention area:

And whereas the Land Sales Committee to which such objection was referred did on the 3rd day of December, 1946, make an order disallowing such objection:

And whereas an appeal was made against such order by the owners in the manner prescribed by the said Act:

And whereas the Land Sales Court did vary the said order by limiting the area of the said lands which the Crown is allowed to take to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto:

And whereas the owners have agreed to an amended vesting-date:

And whereas the said land is not the land of any serviceman who is for the time being serving outside New Zealand in any of His Majesty's Forces or in any British ship:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Lands, acting in pursuance of section 27 of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the lands described in the said Second Schedule hereto are taken for the settlement of discharged servicemen, and hereby specifies the 1st day of July, 1947, as the date on which the said lands shall be deemed to be vested in His Majesty the King.

SOUTHLAND LAND DISTRICT
