## Price Order No. 734 (Amending Price Order No. 665) (Apples and Pears)

**P**URSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Emergency Regulations 1939,\* the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order :---1.
