IT has been decided that the Magnetic Compass Rose on Admiralty charts shall be graduated from $0^{\circ}-359^{\circ}$ clockwise in the future， and this form of graduation will be brought into force as charts are taken up for correction．

In the interim period，therefore，mariners must expect to find some Admiralty charts with the new notation and some with the old－type quadrantal notation．

Attention is drawn to the fact that all bearings quoted in Notices to Mariners and navigational warnings will continue to be true bearings in degrees from $000^{\circ}$（True North）to $359^{\circ}$ measured clockwise．
