PURSUANT to Regulation 4 of the Milk Delivery Emergency Regulations 1945* the Minister of Marketing doth hereby give notice as follows :-

1. This notice may be cited as the Rangiora Milk Delivery

Notice 1948.

2. This notice shall come into force on the Monday following the publication thereof in the Gazette.

3. The Rangiora Milk Delivery Notice 1942†, is revoked as

from the date this notice comes into force.
4. The scheme set out in the Schedule hereto is hereby provided for the said district.

SCHEDULE

THE RANGIORA MILK DELIVERY SCHEME, 1948

(1) For the purposes of this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,

"The district" means the Borough of Rangiora as indicated by zones marked on the plan: "The plan" means the plan of the district deposited for the

purposes of this scheme in the office of the Milk Marketing Division of the Marketing Department at Wellington under No. M.M.D. 9:
"Minister" means the Minister of Marketing:
"Zone" means a zone of the district marked on the said plan.

- (2) For the purposes of assisting in the administration of this scheme there shall be a committee which shall consist of the following
 - (a) Two members to be appointed by the Rangiora Borough Council:
 - (b) One member to be appointed by the parties to this scheme:
 (c) An officer of the Public Service to be appointed by the Director of Milk Marketing.

(3) On the death or resignation of any member of the committee, the vacancy created thereby shall be filled by appointment in the manner in which the vacating member was appointed.

(4) The functions of the committee shall be to receive and investigate complaints affecting the administration of this scheme, to advise the Minister on any matters that may be referred to the committee by the Minister or that may be considered by it of its own motion, and to make recommendations to the Minister for

amending this scheme.

(5) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this scheme, the committee may regulate its procedure in such manner as it thinks
