

along a right line to David Peaks; thence north-westerly along the summit of the watershed between the Eglinton River and the McKellar branch of the Greenstone River; thence south-westerly along the summit of the watershed between Eglinton River and the Hollyford River to Mount Anau; thence along the north-eastern boundary of the aforesaid Wallace County to the sea-coast at Bligh Sound; thence north-easterly along the sea-coast to Westland County; thence south-easterly and north-easterly along the Westland County boundary, as described in *New Zealand Gazette*, 1925, page 1923, to Mount Strauchon on the boundary of the Waitaki Soil-conservation District; thence generally southerly along the western boundary of the Waitaki County, through Mount Huxley and Lindis Pass, to and along Wether Range; thence south-easterly along the leading ridge to Omarama Saddle; thence easterly and southerly along the leading ridge, to and along the summit of the Hawkdun Range; thence southerly, easterly, and southerly along the western boundary of the Waitaki County, through Mount Ida and Dansey Pass to Mount Pisgah; thence north-easterly along Pisgah Spur and Mount Pisgah Road, to and north-easterly along the Mount Pisgah-Tapui Road and Little Road, to and northerly, westerly, and northerly along Conlan's Road, to and north-easterly along Boundary Road, to and south-easterly along McDonald Road and Tussocky Road, to and north-easterly along the road leading to the northern boundary of Pukenui Settlement, to and south-easterly along the Pukeuri-Omarama Main Highway, to and easterly along Seven Mile Road, to and north-easterly along the Dunedin-Timaru Main Highway for approximately 20 chains, to and easterly along a road between Sections 61A and 74A, Steward Settlement, to the sea-coast; thence south-westerly along the sea-coast to the point of commencement. As the same is delineated on the plan marked P.W.D. 126806, deposited in the office of the Minister of Works at Wellington, and thereon bordered blue.

PURSUANT to the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act, 1941, and to section twenty of the Local Government Commission Act, 1946, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the Otago Catchment Board shall consist of ten elective members and five non-elective members, and that the number of such elective members to be representative of each separate constituent district or combined district within the catchment district on the said Board shall be the number specified in the Schedule hereto opposite the name of that constituent district or group of names of constituent districts comprising a combined district, and doth further declare that each group of constituent districts the names of which are bracketed together in the first column of the Schedule hereto is hereby constituted a combined district for the purposes of the said Acts, and that the principal local authority of each such combined district shall be the local authority of the district distinguished in the first column of the Schedule hereto by the letter "(P)".

The Crown Lands (Shirley) Building-line Restriction Regulations 1948

PURSUANT to section forty-one of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1946, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Crown Lands (Shirley) Building-line Restriction Regulations 1948.
2. These regulations shall apply to the land described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the said land).
3. No building or part of a building shall at any time be erected on the said land within a distance of forty-eight feet from the centre-line of portion of a proposed street to be known as Cargill Place.

SCHEDULE

Canterbury Land District

ALL that area containing by admeasurement 2 acres and 36.7 perches, more or less, being Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, and 22, as shown on plan recorded in the office of the Chief Surveyor at Christchurch as S.O. 7931, being part Lot 53, Deposited Plan 7712, part Rural Section 325, City of Christchurch, and being part of the land contained in Certificate of Title, Volume 493, folio 234 (Canterbury Registry). As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 22/4812/9A, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Vesting the Control of Scenic Reserves in the Pounawea Scenic Reserves Board

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand doth hereby revoke a Warrant dated the eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and published in the *Gazette* of the twentieth day of that month, vesting the control of scenic reserves in the Pounawea Scenic Reserves Board, and doth hereby vest the control of the scenic reserves described in the Schedule hereto (being land reserved under the said Act) for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously altered or revoked under the said Act) in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Pounawea Scenic Reserves Board (herein referred to as the Board), in trust, for the preservation of scenery, and with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The first meeting of the Board shall be held on Monday, the fifteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, at eight o'clock p.m., at Pounawea, and thereafter the Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the second Monday in each quarter at the time and place aforesaid, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board.
