

Price Order No. 912 (Amendment No. 1 of Price Order No. 760)
(Superphosphate)

PURSUANT to the powers conferred on it by the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following amending Price Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 912, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 760* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the 29th day of July, 1948.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of the principal Order, where a contract for the sale of any superphosphate to which that Order applies has been entered into between the 30th day of June, 1948, and the date of the coming into force of this Order and the superphosphate has not been delivered or paid for, the maximum price that may be recovered under the contract in respect of the sale of any such superphosphate shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedules to the principal Order as substituted by clause 4 of this Order.

4. The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking the First and Second Schedules thereto, and substituting the following Schedules respectively:—

Applicants should appear personally for examination at the District Lands and Survey Office, Wellington, on Wednesday, 2nd September, 1948, at 10.30 o'clock a.m., but if any applicant is unable to attend he may be examined by any other Land Board or by any Commissioner of Crown Lands.

The ballot will be held immediately upon conclusion of the examination of applicants, and the successful applicants are required to pay immediately at conclusion of ballot a deposit comprising the first half-year's rent, broken-period rent, lease fee, and weighting for improvements.
