

BANKS PENINSULA ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Redemption Loan, 1948, £1,400

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Banks Peninsula Electric-power Board, a corporate body duly incorporated under the Electric-power Boards Act, 1925, hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing interest and other charges on the Board's Redemption Loan, 1948, £1,400, authorized to be raised by Order in Council appearing in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 24, 6th May, 1948, page 477, the Banks Peninsula Electric-power Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-sixtieth of a penny (1/60d.) in the pound (£) upon the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property in the Banks Peninsula Electric-power District, comprising the Borough of Akaroa, the counties of Akaroa, Wairewa, Mount Herbert, and the Diamond Harbour Settlement in the Borough of Lyttelton; and that such rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of September in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of ten years or until the loan is fully paid off.”

Notice of Order Dispensing with Consents or Conditions of Amalgamation
