WELLINGTON LAND DISTRICT.—WELLINGTON CONSERVANCY

Hutt Rural Fire District

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, Hutt and Featherston Counties, containing approximately 155,000 acres, situated in Akatarawa, Eritonga, Paekakariki, Belmont, Rimutaka, Waiohine, Wairarapa, Pencarrow, and Onoke Survey Districts, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north-east by Sections 6, 16, 19, 21, and 22, Ngarara West C Block, and Sections 7 and 11, Block III, Akatarawa Survey District; towards the south-east by permanent State forest (*Gazette*, 1881, page 959); towards the north, south-east, and north-east by the watershed of the Hutt River; towards the north by permanent State forest (*Gazette*, 1881, page 959); towards the east by Sections 541, 542, and 523, Block VIII, Waiohine Survey District, and Section 497, Block III, Wairarapa Survey District; towards the south by the southern side of the main Rimutaka Road; towards the south-east by Sections 463 and 350, Block II, and Section 351, Block I, Wairarapa Survey District; thence by the Rimutaka Range to Trig. Station Baubau in Block IX, Rimutaka Survey District; towards the south-west and again towards the south-east by the summit of the Rimutaka Range; towards the north-east and south-east by permanent State forest (*Gazette*, 1881, page 959), and again by the summit of the Rimutaka Range to the north-eastern boundary of Orongorongo A No. 2 Block; towards the south-west by the last-mentioned block and Parangarau No. 9 Block, to and across the Wainui-o-mata Valley Road; towards the north-west by the north-western sides of the Wainui-o-mata Valley Road and Moore's Valley Road; towards the north-east and north-west by the north-eastern and north-western sides of the Whiteman's Valley Road and the Mungaroa Road; towards the west by Section 298, Block XIV, Akatarawa Survey District, and by the Mungaroa River; towards the north-west by the north-western side of the main Rimutaka Road, and by Sections 181 and 182, Block XV, Akatarawa Survey District; towards the south-east generally by Sections 182 and 114, Block XV aforesaid, Section 1, Block XIV, and Sections 361 and 364, Block X, Akatarawa Survey District, by the eastern side of the Akatarawa-Waikanae Road and the southern side of Campbell's Mill Road, and by the Akatarawa West River; towards the south-east by Section 7, Block X, Akatarawa Survey District, and the south-eastern sides of Snow Hill Road and Goat Hill Road; towards the south-west by the south-western sides of Goat Hill Road and Bull's Run Road; thence by the Wainui Stream, and by another stream intersecting the northern boundary of Section 3, Block VII, Paekakariki Survey District; towards the south by Sections 3 and 2, Block VII aforesaid; towards the west by Sections 64 and 66, Block VII aforesaid, and Section 102, Block IV, Paekakariki Survey District; towards the north-west by Section 102 aforesaid; towards the north-east by Sections 100, 99, 98, and 97, Block IV aforesaid; towards the north-west by Sections 97 and 96, Block IV aforesaid; thence by the Maungakutukutu Stream, and by Sections 16, 12, and 11, Block I, Akatarawa Survey District. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 89/16, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered blue.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 24th day of November, 1948

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Eyrewell Rural Fire District"; and doth hereby specify the trees and other plants on State forests situated in the said area as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and doth hereby specify the period between the first day of October in any one year and the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and doth hereby prescribe that the said Eyrewell Rural Fire District shall be administered by the Commissioner of State Forests for the purposes of the said Act; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the day following publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

CANTERBURY LAND DISTRICT.—CANTERBURY CONSERVANCY

Eyrewell Rural Fire District

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, Oxford and Eyre Counties, containing approximately 52,400 acres, more or less, situated in Oxford, Mairaki, Rolleston, and Hawkins Survey Districts, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north-east by the north-eastern side of Eyre Road South; towards the east and north by Rural Section 9607; towards the south-east by Rural Sections 32745 and 32832, by a right line between the western corner of Rural Section 32832 and the eastern corner of

Rural Section 29684, and by the north-western boundary of Rural Section 32948 and its production to the Waimakariri River; towards the south by the Waimakariri River to a point in line with the western boundary of Rural Section 32080; towards the north-west by a right line to the westernmost corner of Rural Section 32080 aforesaid, by the western boundary of the last-mentioned section, by a right line between the northern corner of the said section and the junction of Thongcater Road with the western side of the water-race reserve in Block III, Hawkins Survey District, and by the said western side of the water-race reserve to and across the Eyre Road South. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 143/21, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT.—AUCKLAND CONSERVANCY

Omahuta-Puketi Rural Fire District

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, Hokianga, Whangaroa, and Bay of Islands Counties, containing approximately 71,000 acres, situated in Blocks VII, VIII, XI, XII, XV, and XVI, Maungataniwha Survey District, Blocks IX, X, XI, XIII, XIV, and XV, Kaeo Survey District, Blocks III, IV, VII, and VIII, Mangamuka Survey District, and Blocks I, II, III, V, and VI, Omapere Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the east by Sections 2 and 4, Block XI, and Section 4, Block XV, Kaeo Survey District, and by O.L.C. 28; towards the south-east by part of O.L.C. 15, Sections 12 and 10, Block XV, Kaeo Survey District, part of Section 2s, Puketi Settlement; towards the north-west by Section 2s aforesaid; towards the north-east by Section 6, Block XV aforesaid; towards the south-east by Sections 1 and 4, Block III, Omapere Survey District, and the Waikaraka Stream; towards the south by the Whakanekeneke Stream; towards the south-west by the Waipapa River and Waihou A Nos. 7 and 6B 4 Blocks; towards the south-east generally by Waihou A No. 6B 4, 6B 5c, and 5B Blocks; towards the north-east generally by Waihou A Nos. 5B and 5c 5 Blocks, and O.L.C. 66; towards the south-east by Waihou A Nos. 4B 2, 4A 2, and 4A 1 Blocks, and the south-eastern side of a public road; towards the south-west by the south-western side of a public road to the north-western corner of Lot 55 on L.T. plan 540, being part of Ahutoatoa Block; towards the south-east by Lot 55 aforesaid and the Wairiki Block; towards the south-west, by the south-western side of the Mangamuka Road; towards the north-west by the north-western side of the Omahuta Valley Road; towards the south-west by Section 14, Block XV, Maungataniwha Survey District, and Mangamuka East No. 1B 1 Block; towards the north-west by the north-western side of the Mangamuka Road; towards the north by the Wainui Stream and Allotments 7 and 8, Pupuke Parish; towards the north-east by Allotments N.E. 17, S.W. 16, S. 39, S. 40, N.E. 38, and S.W. 38, Pupuke Parish; towards the south-east by Allotments W. 47, 50, 52, N. 54, 55, and 56, Pupuke Parish; towards the north-east generally by Allotments 56, 59, N.W. 60, S.E. 60, and N.W. 61, Pupuke Parish, and by the north-eastern side of a road; towards the north-west by the north-western side of a road, by Allotments S. 146, N. 150, 149, Pupuke Parish, the Omaunu Stream, by Allotments 14, 11, and S.W. 10, Matawheroia Parish, and the Taia Stream; and towards the north-east by O.L.C. 25. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 5/37, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.
