PURSUANT to the powers vested in him by section six of the Housing Amendment Act, 1940, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order and declare that the access-way described in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the date of this Order in Council, vest in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of New Lynn and be under the control and management of the New Lynn Borough Council.

PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Tautuku Rural Fire District"; and doth hereby specify the trees and other plants on scenic reserves situated in the said area as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and doth hereby specify the period between the first day of August in any one year and the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and doth hereby prescribe that the said district shall be administered for the purposes of the said Act by the Commissioner of State Forests; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the day following publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE

OTAGO LAND DISTRICT.—SOUTHLAND CONSERVANCY

Tautuku Rural Fire District

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, Clutha County, containing approximately 4,500 acres, situated in Blocks IX and X, Woodland Survey District, Blocks IV and VIII, Tautuku Survey District, and Block XV, Rimu Survey District, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north-west by the Fleming River to a point opposite the westernmost corner of Section 10, Block VIII, Tautuku Survey District; thence by the crossing of a public road, Sections 9 and 11, the crossing of a public road, Sections 37, 31, 32, 33, and 34, the crossing of a public road, Sections 28, 29, a road, and 25, all in Block VIII, Tautuku Survey District, by the crossing of a public road, Sections 5 and 6, Block IV, Tautuku Survey District; towards the west generally by Section 6, Block IV aforesaid, the crossing of a public road, Section 7, the crossing of a public road, Sections 30 and 24, all of Block IV aforesaid, and the crossing of the Tahakopa Valley Road; towards the south-west by the Tahakopa Valley Road; towards the north-west by Section 19, Block IV aforesaid, to and across the Tahakopa River to its left bank; towards the north generally by the left bank of the Tahakopa River, the right bank of the Maclellan River, and by a railway reserve to the north-eastern corner of Section 3, Block IX, Woodlands Survey District; thence by the crossing of a public road, Section 8, the crossing of a public road, Sections 24 and 18, all in Block IX aforesaid, and by the crossing of a public road; towards the north-east by Sections 33, 17, and 21, Block X, Woodlands Survey District; towards the east by the eastern side of a public road, and by McCormack Creek to the Pacific Ocean; towards the south and south-east by the Pacific Ocean; and towards the south-west by the Tautuku River. As the same is more particularly delineated on plan No. 218/22, deposited in the Head Office of the State Forest Service at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act, 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Longwood Rural Fire District"; and doth hereby specify the trees and other plants on State forests situated in the said area as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and doth hereby specify the period between the first day of August in any one year and the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and doth hereby prescribe that the said district shall be administered by the Commissioner of State Forests for the purposes of the said Act; and doth hereby further declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the day following publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SOUTHLAND LAND DISTRICT.—SOUTHLAND CONSERVANCY

Longwood Rural Fire District

ALL that area in the Southland Land District, Wallace County, containing approximately 150,000 acres, situated in Waiau, Wairio, and Longwood Survey Districts, and Aparima and Jacob's River Hundreds, and bounded generally as follows: Towards the north by Sections 82 and 31, Block I, Wairio Survey District; towards the north-east by Sections 88, 32, and 238, Block II, Wairio Survey District, by Section 84, the north-eastern side of a road, Section 169, part of Section 165, and Section 167, all of Block VI, and Section 168, Block IX, Wairio Survey District; towards the south-east by part of Lots 5B, 6B, 7B, and Lot 8B on L.T. plan 275 (Southland Land Registry), Waicolo Estate, being part of Section 5, Block IX, Wairio Survey District; thence by Sections 30, 104, and 103, Block XIII, Wairio Survey District, and by the south-eastern side of a public road; towards the south by Sections 40, 39, and 20, Block IV, Aparima Hundred; towards the east by the eastern side of a road; towards the north-east by the north-eastern side of a road forming the boundary of Sections 27, 28, and 29, Block IV aforesaid, and Sections 36A, 36B, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 11, 8, and 6, Block II, Aparima Hundred; thence by Reserve 56 to the south-eastern corner of Section 32, Block I, Aparima Hundred, and by Sections 35, 36, and 2, Block I aforesaid; towards the east by Lots 5, 6, 7, and 8 on L.T. plan 1909 (Southland Land Registry), being part of Sections 42 and 41, Block VIII, Jacob's River Hundred, and by Sections 40, 39, and 38, Block VIII aforesaid; towards the south-east by Section 36, Block VIII aforesaid, and again towards
