3. That the election notified by the Returning Officer in the Gazette of the thirteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, at page 31, of the said Claude Eric James and the said Ronald William Sansom to represent the Greymouth Urban Area on the Canterbury Education Board shall be valid to all intents and purposes as though such election had been held at the proper time in one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and shall not be called in question by reason only of the time at which such election was held.
