**I**N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Milk Act, 1944, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Masterton Milk District Constitution Order 1949.
2. The Borough of Masterton is hereby constituted and declared a milk district under the Milk Act, 1944, as from the 25th day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, with the name of the "Masterton Milk District."
3. The Milk Authority of the said milk district shall be the Masterton Borough Council.

**W**HEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto has been duly set apart for ferry purposes: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, it is expedient to vest the said reserve in the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Featherston:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in

exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section nine of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall become vested in the Chairman, Councillors, and Inhabitants of the County of Featherston, in trust, for ferry purposes.

*Vesting the Control of a Reserve in the Lower Shotover Public Hall Board*

ORDER IN COUNCIL

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

**W**HEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto is a reserve duly set apart for a site for a public hall: And whereas it is expedient that the control of the said reserve should be vested in a special Board as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section seventeen of the Public Reserves, Domains, and National Parks Act, 1928, doth hereby vest the control of the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, for the period of five years from the date hereof (unless previously amended or revoked under the said Act), in the undermentioned persons, namely,—

Joseph Adam Bagrie,  
Ian Wilson Brown, and  
Thomas Meldrum Houston,

who are hereby constituted for that purpose a special Board by the name of the Lower Shotover Public Hall Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board), with the powers and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, that is to say:—

1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at the Lower Shotover Public Hall, or at such other place and at such time as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Saturday, the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, at eight o'clock p.m., in the Lower Shotover Public Hall.
2. The members of the Board shall at their first meeting and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of any such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
4. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.
5. If by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.
6. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
7. The Board shall have prepared and submitted at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister of Lands as soon as possible after each annual meeting.
8. The Board shall control the said reserve and the building erected thereon for the purposes of a public hall, and shall also afford settlers and residents of Lower Shotover and the surrounding district such facilities for meeting within the said building as may from time to time be determined by the Board: Provided that the Board shall have power to fix reasonable charges for the use of the said building.
