

The Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943—Notice of Intention to Take Lands

THE Minister of Lands acting in pursuance of section 24 of the Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943, as extended by the provisions of section 2 of the Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Amendment Act, 1948, hereby gives notice of his intention to take under Part II of the said Act, the lands described in the First Schedule hereto, and the interest of the lessee in the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, and specifies the 31st day of January, 1950, as the date on which possession of the lands described in the said First and Second Schedules is required, and the 24th day of May, 1949, as the date on or before which objections may be made under section 25 of the said Act.

FIRST SCHEDULE

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT

ALL that parcel of land containing by admeasurement one hundred and fifty (150) acres two (2) roods, more or less, being Section 3A, Block XIII, Kaipara Survey District, and being all of the land described in certificate of title, Vol. 100, folio 229 (Auckland Registry).
