"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £8,700, authorized to be raised by the Westport charges on a loan of £8,700, authorized to be raised by the Westport Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of redeeming at maturity, the outstanding liability in respect of the Town Hall Loan, 1938, of £11,500, and of portion (£5,000) of the Street Works Loan, 1937, of £10,000, the said Westport Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of twopence (2d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the Borough of Westport, comprising the whole of the Borough of Westport; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan payable yearly on the 1st day of November in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of ten years or until the loan is fully paid off."
