

The Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943.—Notice of Intention to Take Lands

THE Minister of Lands, acting in pursuance of section 24 of the Servicemen's Settlement and Land Sales Act, 1943, hereby gives notice of his intention to take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, under Part II of the said Act, and specifies the 1st day of August, 1949, as the date on which possession of the land is required, and the 27th day of June, 1949, as the date on or before which objections may be made under section 25 of the said Act.
