4. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1923, or

its amendments, or any regulations of the fraction Ref. 1923, of its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force. 5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present

for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore. 6. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by by-law fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts, provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed sir in any one year.

7. 10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for twenty-one years as from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time

The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any com-pensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Board in New Zealand.
