RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, and of all other Acts and authorities it thereunto enabling the Opunake Electric-power Board hereby resolves as follows:—

"That, for the purpose of providing interest and other charges on a loan of five thousand pounds (£5,000), authorized to be raised by the Opunake Electric-power Board under the above-mentioned Act for acquiring land, erecting dwellings, and purchasing land with dwellings thereon, the said Opunake Electric-power Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-twentieth of a penny ($\frac{1}{2^{\circ}}$ 0,d.) in the pound upon the rateable value (on the basis of the capital value) of all rateable property in the Opunake Electric-power District as at present constituted; and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of the said loan and be payable yearly on the fourteenth day of June (14th June) in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of fifteen years (15 years) or until the loan is fully paid off."
