**P**URSUANT to section one hundred and sixty-seven of the Maori Land Act, 1931, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby vary an Order in Council made on the fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and published in the *Gazette* on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, at page 735, and affecting Hauturu East B 2, Section 2A, 1A, and other blocks, by excluding therefrom the land described in the Schedule hereto.
