At the time of registration of this minute, 9,867 preference shares of £1 each had been issued and the sum of 2s. 6d. had been and is to be deemed to be paid up on each of the said shares; 9,683 preference ‘B’ shares of £5 each had been issued and the sum of 10s. had been and is to be deemed to be paid up on each of the said shares; and 109,306 preference ‘C’ shares had been issued and the sum of 2s. 6d. had been and is to be deemed to be paid up on each of the said shares. The remaining 108 preference shares, 3,192 preference ‘B’ shares and 40,694 preference ‘C’ shares are unissued.”

THE HUTT VALLEY ELECTRIC-POWER BOARD

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board hereby resolves as follows:—

“That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £200,000 (known as Loan No. 8, 1949), authorized to be raised by the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board under the above-mentioned Act, to provide additional moneys for the further reticulation of the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board's District, the said Hutt Valley Electric-power Board hereby makes and levies a special rate of six-tenths of a penny ($\frac{6}{10}$ d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property of the Hutt Valley Electric-power District; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the 31st day of March in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty-five (25) years or until the loan is fully paid off.”

The foregoing resolution was duly passed at a meeting of the Hutt Valley Electric-power Board on 17th November, 1949.
