Allocating Land Taken for a Railway to the Purposes of a Street at Otorohanga

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto forms part of land taken for the purposes of the North Island Main Trunk Railway, and it is considered desirable to allocate such land to the purposes of a street:

Now, therefore, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Bernard Cyril Freyberg, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by section two hundred and twenty-six of the Public Works Act, 1928, and of every other power and authority in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall, upon the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, become a street, and that the said street shall be under the control of the Otorohanga Town Board, and shall be maintained by the said Board in like manner as other public highways are controlled and maintained by the said Board.

SCHEDULE

APPROXIMATE area of the piece of land: 11.17 perches. Being portion of railway land in *Gazette* No. 29 of 1886, page 596.

Situated in Block IV, Orahiri Survey District, Otorohanga Town District. (S.O. 28496.)

In the South Auckland Land District; as the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked L.O. 4151, deposited in the office of the Minister of Railways at Wellington, and thereon coloured blue.
