Exempted Goods (Control of Prices) Notice 1950, No. 4

**P**URSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby revokes every Price Order in force and every approval given under section 16 of the said Act so far as any such Price Order or approval relates to the sale of new potatoes. This revocation shall be deemed to have come into force prior to the coming into force of the exemption referred to in clause 2 of this Notice.

2. Pursuant to section 18 of the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby gives notice that new potatoes are exempt from the provisions of Part III of the Control of Prices Act, 1947.

3. In this Notice "new potatoes" means potatoes grown in New Zealand that are the produce of seed potatoes planted after the 31st day of January in any year and are sold for delivery after the 31st day of May in that year and on or before the last day of February of the following year.
