(ii) That in giving the approval, the Town-planning Board has extended the area to be dealt with in the regional planning scheme to include the Borough of St. Kilda being the area within the jurisdiction of the St. Kilda Borough Council; and

(iii) That the area to be comprised in the regional planning scheme shall be that defined in the Third Schedule hereto:
