PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby grant, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, a licence authorizing The Seddonville Community Centre (Incorporated), a duly incorporated society, having its registered office at Seddonville (hereinafter referred to as the licensee), to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto.

# CONDITIONS

# 1. Implied Conditions

The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

### 2. LICENCE SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS

The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1934, and with all regulations made or to be made in amplification of amendment thereof or in substitution therefor.

#### 3. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY

The system of supply shall be an alternating-current system as described in paragraph (d) of clause 21–01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

### 4. Purpose for Which Electricity Supplied

The electrical energy supplied in accordance with these presents shall be used for lighting purposes only.

### 5. CHARGE ON SALE

The charge for the sale of electrical energy shall not exceed 12s. per calendar month per consumer.

### 6. DURATION OF LICENCE

Unless sooner lawfully determined, this licence shall continue in force until the 31st day of March, 1970, or until electrical energy is available from an Electric-power Board or other public source of supply, whichever is the earlier.
