*Plants Declared Noxious Weeds in the Borough of Upper Hutt (Notice No. Ag. 4963)*

**T**HE following Special Order made by the Upper Hutt Borough Council on the 24th day of January, 1951, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Noxious Weeds Act, 1950.

## SPECIAL ORDER

"THAT the following plants be declared noxious weeds within the Borough:—

" Bindweed (*Convolvulus arvensis*),  
" Blackberry (*Rubus fruticosus* and *R. Laciniatus*),  
" Broom (*Cytisus scoparius*),  
" Gorse (*Ulex* sp.),  
" Greater bindweed (*Calystegia sepium*),  
" Heath (*Erica lusitanica*),  
" Hemlock (*Conium maculatum*),  
" Silver poplar (*Populus alba nivea*),  
" Sweetbrier (*Rosa eglantaria*),  
" Hakea (*Hakea acicularis* and *H. saligna*),  
" Fennel (*Foeniculum vulgare*),  
" Lupin (*Lupinus arboreus*),  
" Ragwort (*Senecio jacobaea*),  
" St John's wort (*Hypericum perforatum*),  
" Tauhinu (*Cassinia leptophylla*),  
" Tutsan (*Hypericum androsaemum*),
