## SPECIAL ORDER

"In exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Noxious Weeds Act, 1950, the Opotiki County Council hereby resolves and declares by way of special order that the following plants, being plants mentioned in the First Schedule to the said Act, are Noxious Weeds within the County of Opotiki:—

"Blackberry (*Rubus fruticosus* and *Rubus laciniatus*),  
"Ragwort (*Senecio jacobaea*)."
