(d) Steam-engines, gas-engines, oil-engines, and electric or other motors are not, unless otherwise indicated, to be regarded as parts of the machines with which they are imported. (c) Surtax as provided for in section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1930, or primage duty as provided for in section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act, 1931, as the case may be, is payable in addition to the duties set out hereunder.

Price Order No. 1244 (Amendment No. 2 of Price Order No. 1218) (Main Crop Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act, 1947, the Price Tribunal, acting with the authority of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, hereby makes the following amending Price Order :-

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1244, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1218* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order). 2. This Order shall come into force on the 10th day of May,

1951.

1951. 3. The principal Order is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (2) of clause 7 the words "At the rate of 32s. 6d. per ton of potatoes for sacks certified by an official grader appointed by the New Zealand Grain, Seed, and Produce Merchants' Federation as new sacks, or at the rate of 28s. 6d. per ton of potatoes for sacks not so certified "and substituting the words" "At the rate of 42s. 6d. per ton of potatoes".
