Exemption Order Under the Motor-drivers Regulations, 1940

A motor-driver's licence issued under the Motor-drivers Reg-ulations, 1940, to the person described in Column 1 of the Schedule hereunder, may authorize him to drive a heavy trade motor in the course of his employment on a farm or market garden of the em-ployer described in Column 2 of the said Schedule, but shall not authorize him, while he is under the age of eighteen years, to drive a heavy trade motor for any other purpose.
