PURSUANT to the Public Works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor General setting by and with the **P**GOVENOLATE to the rubble works Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorize Thomas William Green and Samuel John Green, both of Tatare, Farmers (hereinafter referred to as the licensees), subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the Schedule hereto.

CONDITIONS

1. IMPLIED CONDITIONS
