(2) That persons, firms, or organizations considering themselves or their members likely to be materially affected by the continuance of the import licensing of these goods and desirous of lodging an objection to such continuance, must do so in writing by sending five copies of the statement of objections addressed to the undersigned so as to reach him on or before the 27th July, 1951:

(3) That each statement lodged as above should relate only to one of the above items and should state clearly but concisely the

grounds of the objection to continuance: and

(4) That in the event of the Board desiring to hear oral representations in regard to the objections, notice will be given to both the objectors to the exemption from licensing and the objectors to the continuance of licensing of the time or times fixed for hearings.
