Social Security Act, 1938—The Drug Tariff (September, 1946) Amendment No. 12: Notice Regarding Amendments to Pre-scription Prices in the New Zealand Formulary, Part 2

The reference in Part 2 of the New Zealand Formulary to the First, Second, and Third Schedules to the Rules of Prescription the first, Second, and Third Schedules to the Kules of Prescription Pricing shall, where applicable, be deemed to be the Prescription Pricing Supplement 1951/2, issued by the Pharmacy Plan Industrial Committee. This amendment shall take effect with respect to all medical prescriptions and midwifery orders (whatever the date thereof) that are presented to a contractor for fulfilment on or after the 1st August, 1951.
